## July 2021 MEETING FOR BUSINESS MINUTES

### Corvallis Friends Meeting for Worship for Business July 11, 2021

**Meeting began in expectant quiet worship.**

**The minutes of the previous month were approved** as printed in the newsletter.

Bob Ward presented a brief **Treasurer's Report**. He estimated that our checking account balance increased by around \$500.00 this past month. **The report was accepted with gratitude.**

**Spiritual Care Committee's** new and outgoing members have met and provided a **written report which was approved.**

Judy Hays-Eberts is resigning after two years of gifted service with SCC. Meeting thanks her for her service. Nominating Committee will search for a replacement.

Kathy Miller and Jay Thatcher plan to co-clerk SCC. Jay will take the lead on email communications and building lists of agenda. Kathy will lead on personal communication to support individuals. Abigail will continue to schedule worship with individual Friends who are not able to attend.

Hosting of worship at the Meetinghouse is being coordinated by Jeff and Abigail. Hosting and greeting on Zoom will be coordinated by Judy.

SCC is considering some changes in the process at the rise of worship. They would like to keep it simple and yet provide opportunities to get to know each other. Please contact any one on SCC with suggestions.

Friends noted that we have been gathering in different ways to worship together: walking meeting, online, in the Meetinghouse, and as individuals.

**The next SCC meeting is planned for 8/12/21 at 1:15pm.**

After a lengthy discussion, **meeting approved this policy** which will be posted outside and inside the doors of the Meetinghouse:

1. Each attendee over age twelve, by virtue of their presence at in-person meeting, affirms that they are fully vaccinated against Covid-19. If an individual who wishes to attend in-person Meeting for Worship is not fully vaccinated, they should contact the Spiritual Care Committee prior to attending in-person, so that the Committee can consider their situation.
2. Each attendee will attempt to allow distance between themselves and others in the Meetinghouse and while attending in-person Meeting for Worship. Seating in the Meetinghouse will be arranged in an attempt to facilitate distance.
3. While attending in-person Meeting for Worship, attendees will attempt to ventilate the Meetinghouse as much as is practically feasible given weather conditions.
4. Friends are welcome to wear a mask.

**House and Hospitality** reported that the new cleaning service will start regular cleaning of the Meetinghouse tomorrow.

**Sid and Sherry Rosen** will be moving out of Corvallis this summer. Meeting expressed great gratitude for their service and presence as part of our community.

**Nominating Committee** proposed and Meeting approved Jeff Kline as Meetinghouse Scheduler. We have not yet decided when to open the Meetinghouse to outside groups, but this will allow Jeff time to learn the procedures from Sid.

**Peace Justice and Environment:** Donna Gerry shared a petition that peace and environmental activists are hoping CFM and/or individuals within may want to sign.

" We ask COP26 to set strict greenhouse gas emissions limits that make no exception for militarism, include transparent reporting requirements and independent verification, and do not rely on schemes to "offset" emissions. Greenhouse gas emissions from a country's overseas military bases must be fully reported and charged to that country, not the country where the base is located."

# James Anderson Kimball 1936-2021

## *Memorial Minute*

James Kimball was born in Michigan on November 16, 1936, the eldest of three siblings. He loved growing up in Detroit and Chicago. When Jim was 14 the family moved to New York. He returned to his roots to attend Purdue University and the University of Chicago, working happy summers on a dairy farm while earning a Master's degree in Physics.

He met Margreta Gerhart in New York in 1959, traveled by VW Beetle with her to California, married and settled in Berkeley where Jim studied linguistics. Daughter Sara and son Daniel were born in 1961 and 1965.

Amidst all these challenges and changes of life, Jim became an expert pilot and flight instructor. He also helped form a commune in Southern Oregon, built a cabin there and managed the farm. When it disbanded, he worked tirelessly as a chief flight instructor in New York until 1973. The family moved to Corvallis so that Jim could study Electrical Engineering. He and Greta divorced in 1976.

During the 1960's, Jim's strong pacifist values and opposition to the Vietnam war led him to the Quakers. He attended Meeting in Berkeley, then Corvallis in the mid-1970's, and Strawberry Creek (Berkeley) where he became a member.

From 1978-1995, Jim worked for electric utilities in Portland and Chicago. When he retired, he returned to Corvallis to stay, after 50-some peripatetic years. He transferred membership to Corvallis Friends Meeting.

Jim was the central figure in managing the renovation of the Corvallis Meeting House, comprising the Meeting room, expanded room for children, an entrance way and facilities. With Henry Van Dyke, Wayne Yarnall and Bob Burton, Jim led the realization of Laurie Childers' vision from design to details. As with the others involved in the initial construction, he always had a special feeling of belonging for that meeting room.

Sometime later, he found in Buddhist meditation a practice and discipline that evolved his consciousness and serenity. Meeting saw little of him for some years.

Friends were gratified when he returned to Quakers, and then joined the new Corvallis FCNL Advocacy team in 2019. He spoke passionately of his respect for and affinity with the Quaker path to peace, justice and equality. In later life, he sought to activate the Light in the world through advocacy, alongside inner illumination through meditation.

Jim continued to enjoy travelling, camping and hiking. He was an avid music lover with a collection ranging from opera and plainsong through instrumental classics to world music and even abstract modern works.

James Anderson Kimball died peacefully shortly after midnight on March 3, 2021.

He is remembered by Friends for the following attributes.

Jim was a private person, fiercely independent, steadfast in his convictions, forthright in his preferences, and faithful to simplicity in his life. He found it difficult to accept help, yet he was notably generous. He gave practical and emotional support to Friends and friends from Vancouver through the Bay Area and

even to Central America. Corvallis Friends recall frequent acts of kindness. People who shared private times with Jim found him warm, curious, attentive and interesting. More than one Friend admired Jim's ability to listen respectfully and patiently and to reflect before responding in a respectful and usually enlightening manner.

In recent years, medical and physical conditions limited and frustrated Jim's participation. He enjoyed walks with Friends as long as he could. He wanted to be with people, and deeply appreciated all who came to visit on his patio to eat, explore matters of substance, reminisce and laugh together. Because of his travels, Jim and visitors often found they had places and experiences in common. His dog Cory shared many of those.

Friends agree that Jim Kimball was a valuable asset to the Meeting, and through the legacy of our Meeting room itself, will be remembered for a long time. He is admired by many and missed by all who gained his friendship.

Jim is survived by daughter Sara Kimball, son Daniel Harris, and grandchildren Annamaria Kimball, Alexander Harris and Julian Harris.
