### **How do Quakers live in community?**

*Community is implicit in our very name—the Religious Society of Friends. Though each of us has our own personal understanding of, and relationship with, God or Spirit or the divine, it's important for us to come together in worship, to share messages and insights with each other. Being a community is more than just everyone showing up in the same space at the same time, though; it's about learning to set aside personal differences and act as a unified force for good.*

**No Meeting for Business was held in August, Friends approved the Minutes from July's Meeting for Business with a correction of a detail (change the name Jay to Jeff in section on referring to questions about use of Meetinghouse)**

**Treasurer's Report: was approved.** Wendy thanked Bob Ward for managing the finances in her absence

**Spiritual Care Committee met on Saturday, September 10.**

**1. The next SCC Meeting will be Wednesday, October 5, 3:30-5:30 at the Meeting House and via Zoom.**

**2. SCC wants the Meeting to decide whether the Meeting should buy a HEPA Air Filter for the Meeting Room.** This would be both to improve the air quality due to Covid and due to bad air quality from fires. If the Meeting approves this purchase, SCC recommends a small committee be appointed to investigate, purchase and install the filter. **Friends also suggested they look into a heat exchange system that would bring in more fresh air. Meeting approved a committee to investigate and report next month.** John, Donna and Bob Burton volunteered.

**3. We need to have more people who are trained in how to do the technology for hybrid meetings.** If we had more volunteers, no one would have to run that many meetings. If you are interested in getting trained, please contact a member of the SCC.

**4. SCC is discussing ways to improve the accessibility of Meeting for Worship and Meeting for Business for people who have hearing problems.** A small group is already investigating the use of simultaneous transcription from zoom as a way of improving reception for the hearing impaired. Also the use of a hand held microphone that speakers would go to for vocal ministry might help. That this might be intimidating to people wavering about speaking in Meeting was considered. That passing a mic could pass pathogens was another idea to consider.

**5. Our last joint outdoor Meeting and Potluck will be Sunday, September 18 at Riverbend Park at 10 a.m.** Bring your own chair, a potluck contribution and your own plates, cutlery and drinks. Directions will be published in the Wednesday Digest.

### **Grounds Report**

**Welcoming Presence:** Nina Joy and Laura would like a sign with the name of our Meeting and the usual meeting times located closer to the sidewalk. Under the new crepe myrtle tree we could have a

bench where passers-by could linger in our front yard. Both ideas were approved. John Selker offered to use his own oak "slab" to make a bench and to produce an engraved sign with another piece of oak. Meeting gratefully approved.

Meeting Scheduler Jeff Kline reported that since we reopened Meeting House two of our former users have resumed use. Former users have been told that we were requiring masking and some have cited this as a reason that they wouldn't be coming back. Jeff requested clarification whether this is correct. An alternative rule might be that each user group might have that option so long as there was sufficient time allotted between groups to restore the safety of the meeting rooms before other groups, especially our Meeting Community, which has elderly and vulnerable members.

Meeting approved that Jeff is free to leave this to individual groups with notification of the risk they might choose to assume.


