### Treasurer's Report - was Accepted

**Report of Threshing Session on Meeting Outreach Contributions** The outcome of the threshing process was to encourage the Meeting to emphasize in its giving, the goal of locally reducing the amount of homelessness and economic inequality. We also discussed the Quaker groups we donate to and a desire to treat them all equally. FWCC started Right Sharing of World Resources. The main change suggested was to add Unity Shelter to our list of recipients. Wendy recommended approval of a \$12,400 total as our aspirational Outreach budget to be revisited in December Meeting for Business. **Approved:**
