Hosting WQM Spring 2025-Update

- Bob Ward, Marybetts Sinclair, and Kathy Miller met with Helen Park of Eugene Friends Meeting and Kathleen Hering of South Mountain Friends Meeting. A list of venues has been narrowed down to three possibilities.
- Coming up, two planning groups will begin work on the details of the WQM meeting.
 1. WQM committees will plan Meeting for Business, Meeting for Worship, and Worship Sharing
 2. CFM will develop the theme of the meeting, find volunteers to assist in planning and in implementing logistical detail of the meeting. Volunteers are needed for:

 - Health and safety arrangements
 - Plan B arrangements
 - Activity support

Sponsorship of Showing of Gaza Documentary at Corvallis Public Library

Meeting considered a request from Georg Stahl for co- sponsoring the movie Where the Olive Trees Weep, which will be shown Sept. 22 at the Corvallis public library, sponsored by the organization Palestine Solidarity (and possibly by Jewish Voices for Peace and others).

After lengthy discussion to understand more about the movie, reservations in sponsoring it without knowledge of the current sponsors, and frustration expressed that Meeting is not more engaged in issues surrounding the long-term Gaza situation, we decided the following **Action points**:

- ❖ To rent and show the documentary at CFM Meeting House, September 8. A potluck and discussion will be held following the movie.
- ❖ Bob Ward will arrange to rent the streaming rights for that night.
- ❖ Invitations to follow up discussion with people of differing views on the situation, are deferred.
- ❖ A decision to co-sponsor the library showing is deferred.

Announcements

1. Clarification was made that what was formerly known as Spiritual Care Committee (SCC), is now two committees:
 - Pastoral Care Committee (Laura Horsey – Clerk, Abigail Stoughton, Loreen Olufson). This committee is responsible for F/friends in need of care, marriage, and membership, among other duties.
 - Worship and Ministry (Wendy Robinson – Clerk, Carmen Brummet, and Esther Schiedel). This committee is responsible to foster and strengthen the spiritual life of the meeting.

2. Plans to visit the Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde Chachalu Museum and Cultural Center are underway. September 14 and 21 are optional days to attend when the museum can arrange a guided tour.

3. Meeting for Worship will take place August 18 at Ona Beach. Expected temperatures will be in the 50s/60s, so dress warmly. Friends will meet at 8:30 at the Meeting House, to car pool out to the coast.



Review of A New Book in Your Library:

*God's Part in Our Art:
Making Friends with the Creative Spirit*
(by Linda Seger)

This compact little book is written from a kaleidoscope of perspectives: Linda Seger is a theologian with degrees in Drama and Theology and Feminist Theology, a script consultant, a freestyle reining horse competitor, and winner of the International Duo Piano Competition. Her spiritual director is a

Benedictine Nun. She has been a Quaker for over 50 years.

Seger's opinions are delivered with impact. For example, she suggests watching the 1 1/2 minute video of Bambi meets Godzilla online to illustrate her point that art needs to recognize evil, not just Disneyfy reality. Unsure whether she and her husband would be able to emotionally do a tour of Auschwitz, they challenged each other to find God in Auschwitz. They did. In a number of different ways.

She also asks the reader questions: "Is it possible to incarnate grace and put it into our art?" "How would we respond if we understood those creative moments come from the Creative Spirit who flows through us and opens us to these new thoughts?"

If nothing else, have a glance at the Bibliography at the end of this book with titles like *Integration of Abilities: Exercises for Creative Growth*, *The Empty Space* and *The Shape of Content*.

Seeger's latest book is Seeking the Light: A Quaker Journey for Quakers and Non-Quakers.
