Reports of Volunteer Coordinators

Outreach – Jay Thatcher seeks volunteers. 6 PM Sunday Sept 22 at the meeting house and online will be a “called meeting” to get a plan together. Sept 27 noon-4PM Beaver community contact in the MU Quad. Please sign up for slots to be at the table – specially noon-2:30 PM at the table. Jay asked for \$200 additional to budget to cover the MU event and printing costs for fliers. This addition to the budget for outreach was approved.

House and hospitality – Fabric to blank-out windows opposite the screen will be going up.

Treasurer's Report

Overview: Rental income has been up (\$672), cleaning and utilities were for 2 months (almost \$600). It seems that currently rental income nearly offsets the costs of maintaining the house. The report was accepted with gratitude.

Nominating Committee Report

Ministry and Worship Committee asked Nominating Committee to nominate an additional member to Ministry and Worship.

We met in a spirit of worship on September 1st. After a period of reflection, Nominating Committee agreed to nominate Nina Joy Lawrence for the additional member of Ministry and Worship, and are presenting this nomination to Meeting for Worship for Business. The nomination was approved.

Corvallis Meeting needs everyone's gifts. Every spring (and again as openings arise) Nominating Committee employs a process of checking with attenders and members, reflection, and discernment to adopt a roster of proposed roles for the July to July period. As with many Quaker meetings, we have no paid clergy and therefore rely on each other to keep the Meeting operational and to provide support on both practical and spiritual levels. Worship and Ministry Committee (W&M) Report

Deepening spiritual connection is the goal of this coming 9 months. 6:30 PM Sept 29 there will be a worship sharing gathering. Hybrid participation will be welcome. Timing of future meetings will be decided by the group that meets on Sept 29.

Hosting WQM Spring 2025-Update

For the May (TBD) 2025 Quarterly Meeting. A planning committee is sought to be filled in the coming month. There will be an on-line sign up following some telephone conversations on the process. Corvallis Meeting will pick the theme, and in general is responsible for how the logistics flow.



Report on field trip to Grande Ronde

More than a dozen of us toured the Chachalu Tribal Museum and Cultural Center in Grand Ronde, OR on Sept 21st. We were treated to an open-hearted sharing of how people lived communally in cedar plank houses during the winters, and learned about the main foods they harvested. We got to touch fabrics made from pounded inner bark of the western red cedar, some stone mortar and pestles, and a lovely canoe used for harvesting *wapato*, salmon fishing, and for journeying. The importance of the forest, and use of cultural fire, remains part of life. Our guide shared how the trauma inflicted upon native people by settlers moving in and destroying existing cultures had left "a hole in her soul" that she had tried to fill with alcohol - but that didn't work. Now, whenever traditional cultural practices such as the canoe journeys are revived and experienced, she feels that hole being truly filled and healed.

Advices & Queries - Unity

Unity is found in God's will. If we are divided, when we listen in the Spirit together the way forward will become clear.

Each of us has particular transcendent experiences, and each must find ways to be true to them. When an expression of that experience is strange or disturbing, we try to sense where it comes from and how it might nourish the lives of others.

People understand the Divine in many different ways.

Listen patiently and seek the truth which other people's opinions may contain for you. Avoid using hurtful criticism or language chosen to provoke anger or fear.

Do not allow the strength of your convictions to betray you into making statements or allegations that are unfair or untrue.

Think it possible that you may be mistaken.

Cultivate affectionate regard and mutual care for each other. Look for times and occasions in addition to meeting on first days to gather together affirming a common life that leads to a deeper unity.

- When problems and conflicts arise, how do we work to resolve them in a spirit of love and humility?
- How do we let go of our individual desires and let the Holy Spirit lead us to unity?
- How do we open ourselves to the diversity of culture, language, and expressions of faith in our yearly meeting and in the world community of Friends?
- How do we respect the reputations of others? Do we avoid gossip? Do we protect necessary confidentiality?
- How careful are we to avoid manipulating and exploiting one another?
